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2. DETAILS OF THE OFFER

2.1 The Offer

The Company is making a pro-rata non-renounceable rights issue of Securities to Shareholders who are registered as at 5.00 pm WST on 30 July 2013 ("Record Date").

The Offer is made on the basis that for every 2 Shares held as at the Record Date, Shareholders as Eligible Participants will have the right to subscribe for 1 new Share at an issue price of 2.5 cents each. Each Eligible Participant will be entitled to receive 1 Option for every 2 new Shares subscribed for under the Prospectus for no extra consideration. The exercise price of the Options is 5 cents and the expiry date is 31 December 2014. The full terms of the Options are set out in section 5.2.

In the calculation of any entitlement, fractions will be rounded down to the nearest whole number.

Based on the capital structure of the Company at the date of this Prospectus, approximately 21,812,500 Shares and 10,906,250 Options will be offered pursuant to this Offer to raise approximately \$545,312 (before the costs of the Offer).

As at the date of this Prospectus, the Company has a total of 26,812,500 Existing Options and Performance Rights on issue (Refer to section **3.2 Effect of the Offer and Capital Structure**). The terms of those Existing Options do not allow for participation by Option holders in new issues of securities. Those Option holders are, however, able to exercise their Existing Options according to their terms and conditions. If any Existing Options are exercised before the Record Date then the number of Shares offered under this Prospectus will increase.

This Offer is made on a non-renounceable basis which means that Eligible Participants may not sell or transfer all or part of the Entitlement. If an Entitlement is not taken up under the Offer by the Closing Date, the Entitlement will lapse.

The Entitlement of each Shareholder is shown on the Entitlement and Acceptance Form accompanying this Prospectus. The details of how to accept the Entitlement are set out below.

2.2 No Minimum Subscription

There is no minimum subscription.

2.3 Underwriter

The Company has appointed Pareto Capital Pty Ltd as the Underwriter to the Offer under the terms of the Underwriting Agreement.

The Offer is underwritten up to the Underwritten Amount of \$545,312 in accordance with the terms of the Underwriting Agreement. The Underwriter will be paid a fee for underwriting the Offer of 6% (plus GST), calculated on the total underwritten amount as well as 4 million Options. The material terms of the Underwriting Agreement are set out in section 6.1.

The Underwriting Agreement provides for the appointment of sub-underwriters. Fees payable to the sub-underwriters are at the discretion of the Underwriter. The Company is not responsible for any payment of fees to sub-underwriters.

3. PURPOSE AND EFFECT OF THE OFFER

3.1 Purpose of Offer and use of funds

The purpose of the Offer is to raise funds of approximately \$545,312 (before estimated expenses of the Offer). The proceeds of the Offer are intended to be applied as follows:

Exploration is planned to comprise sampling and drill testing of the Company's recently acquired gold projects in Côte d'Ivoire. These projects cover approximately 1,200 km² and were selected from a predictive study based on geophysical data to target areas that have, in the Company's view, prospective geology that could host significant gold mineralisation. The Company intends to test this theory and, in particular, to test the claim from a previous exploration company that one of the licences holds widespread gold-in-soil anomalism.

The information set out in this Section is indicative only and is a statement of present intention as at the date of this Prospectus. The exact quantum of funds expended by the Company on any particular item may change depending on the Company's circumstances and priorities. The Board reserves the right to alter the way funds are applied on this basis.

The amount of general working capital referred to above may be applied towards corporate administration costs or applied towards expenses incurred in the event that any new resource projects are identified.

To the extent additional funds are raised and additional Shares and Options are issued (as a result of the exercise of Existing Options), proceeds will be allocated to general working capital and the issued capital items in the capital structure table and the cash and cash equivalents in the pro-forma balance sheet set out in section 3.3 will be adjusted accordingly. The Company does not anticipate any of the Existing Options will be exercised as the exercise price is significantly greater than the current share price.

3.2 Effect of the Offer and Capital Structure

The direct effect of the Offer will be to increase the number of Shares and Options on issue by approximately 21,812,500 Shares and 10,906,250 Options.

The pro-forma financial information is presented in an abbreviated form, insofar as it does not include all of the disclosures required by Australian Accounting Standards applicable to annual financial statements.

The unaudited pro-forma Balance Sheet has been prepared by adjusting the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2013 to reflect the financial effect of the following transactions as if they had occurred at 31 March 2013:

- (a) The issue of 21,812,500 Shares at an issue price of 2.5 cents per Share and 10,906,250 Options issued in accordance with this Prospectus raising approximately \$545,312.
- (b) Cash costs of \$52,719 associated with the Shares and Options issued under this Prospectus representing an underwriting fee of \$32,719 to the Underwriter and other Prospectus costs of \$20,000.

- (c) Net cash proceeds of the issue therefore being \$492,593.
- (d) A “share based payment” of \$55,442 resulting from the issue of 4,000,000 Options to the Underwriter as part of its fee.

4. RISK FACTORS

4.1 Introduction

The Securities offered under this Prospectus as well as an investment generally in the Company's securities is considered highly speculative, and involve investors being exposed to risk. The Directors strongly recommend investors examine the contents of this Prospectus and consult their professional advisers before deciding whether to apply for Securities pursuant to this Prospectus or make an investment generally in the Company's securities.

The following is a non-exhaustive list of the risks that may have a material effect on the financial position and performance of the Company and the value of its securities as well as the Company's exploration and development activities and an ability to fund those activities.

The specific risks below are some of the risks specific to the Company including by reason of its involvement in the mineral resource industry.

4.2 Company Specific Risks

Exploration Projects

The Company's Côte d'Ivoire Gold Projects and its Guinea Iron Ore Projects are at the exploration phase. Any adverse changes or developments affecting these projects, such as, but not limited to, obtaining financing on commercially suitable terms, hiring and retaining suitable personnel and contractors or receiving the necessary government licences, may have a material adverse effect on the Company's financial performance and results of operations.

Exploration success

At present, no JORC Code compliant resources have been identified on the Côte d'Ivoire Gold Projects on which the Company will be conducting exploration. Potential investors should understand that mineral exploration and project development are high risk undertakings. There can be no assurance that exploration of these projects or the Company's Guinea Iron Ore Projects, or any other tenements that may be acquired in the future, will result in the discovery of an economic ore deposit. Even if an apparently viable deposit is identified, there is no guarantee that it can be economically exploited. Until the Company is able to realise value from its Projects, it is likely to incur ongoing operating losses.

Drilling and exploration programs

There are operational risks associated with the Company's drilling and exploration programs. The planned surface sampling, drilling and exploration programs at the Côte d'Ivoire Gold Projects may be affected by a range of factors, including:

- geological and ground access conditions
- unavailability of drilling equipment, including but not limited to drill rods, fuel and site supplies
- unanticipated operational and technical difficulties encountered in sampling and drilling activities
- adverse weather conditions, environmental accidents, and unexpected shortages or increases in the costs of consumables, spare parts, and labour
- mechanical failure of operating plant and equipment

- prevention of access by reason of political or civil unrest, outbreak of hostilities, inability to obtain regulatory consents or approvals
- terms imposed by government on development of mining projects including conditions such as equity participation, royalty rates and taxes
- risks of default or non-performance by third parties providing essential services.

No assurance can be given that planned and future exploration will be successful or that a commercial mining operation at the Côte d'Ivoire Gold Projects will eventuate.

Sovereign and Country Risk

The Company's operations in respect of the projects in Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea are exposed to various levels of political, economic and other risks and uncertainties associated with operating in a foreign jurisdiction. In addition, any material adverse changes in government policies or legislation in Côte d'Ivoire or Guinea affecting foreign ownership of mineral interests, taxation, profit repatriation, royalties, labour relations, and mining and exploration activities, may adversely affect the viability and profitability of the Company's assets in that country.

Côte d'Ivoire has experienced significant civil unrest at various times over the past decade, including a civil war that ended in 2003, and widespread fighting in early 2011 following Presidential elections. The current Government is focused on rebuilding the country's infrastructure and encourages investment in the mining sector, but remains at risk of disruption from opposition forces. In addition there is a continuing heightened risk of retaliatory attacks against Western targets in Côte d'Ivoire following the French intervention in the conflict in Mali in January 2013. Terrorist groups in the region have declared their intention to increase attacks and kidnappings targeting Westerners. As a result of the unpredictable security environment the Company may experience significant delays to its plans to discover and develop mineral resources on the projects.

Metals and Currency Price Volatility

The Company's ability to proceed with the development of the Côte d'Ivoire Gold Projects and Guinea Iron Ore Projects and benefit from any future mining operations will depend on market factors, some of which may be beyond its control. The world market for minerals is subject to many variables and may fluctuate markedly.

These variables include world demand for gold and iron ore, forward selling by producers and production cost levels in major mineral-producing regions. Minerals prices are also affected by macroeconomic factors such as general global economic conditions and expectations regarding inflation and interest rates. These factors may have an adverse effect on the Company's exploration, development and production activities, as well as on its ability to fund those activities.

Gold and iron ore are principally sold throughout the world in US dollars. The Company's cost base will be payable in various currencies including Australian dollars, West African CFA francs and GNF Guinea Francs. As a result, any significant and/or sustained fluctuations in the exchange rate between these currencies and US dollars, could have a materially adverse effect on the Company's operations, financial position (including revenue and profitability) and performance. The Company may undertake measures, where deemed necessary by the Board to mitigate such risks.

Licences

All of the tenements or licences in which the Company has an interest are subject to applications for renewal. The renewal terms of each tenement or licence are usually at the discretion of the relevant government authority.

Additionally, tenements are subject to a number of government specific legislative conditions. The inability to meet these conditions could affect the standing of a tenement or restrict its ability to be renewed.

If a tenement or licence is not renewed or granted, the Company may suffer significant damage through loss of the opportunity to develop and discover any mineral resources on that tenement.

The exploration licence that comprises the Guinea Iron Ore Projects is in the process of being renewed by the Guinea Ministry of Mines and Geology. Conditions for licence renewal as set out in the Guinea Mining Code have been satisfied and the renewal application was submitted in accordance with regulatory requirements. There is no certainty that the Company will be successfully granted the licence.

Lack of Infrastructure

The transportation and service infrastructure in Côte d'Ivoire and Guinea is sub-standard and unpredictable. Material delays in the transportation of equipment, supplies and resources may delay the exploration and development of the Company's projects. Any such delay is likely to increase the cost of exploring developing the projects, and such increase may materially affect the Company's business, results of operations and financial condition.

Future Capital Needs and Additional Funding

The funds raised by the Offer will be used to carry out the Company's objectives as detailed in this Prospectus and the Company's announcements to ASX. The Company's ability to raise further capital (equity or debt) within an acceptable time, of a sufficient amount and on terms acceptable to the Company will vary according to a number of factors, including the results of planned exploration programs, subsequent feasibility studies, stock market and industry conditions and commodity prices and exchange rates.

No assurance can be given that future funding will be available to the Company on favourable terms (or at all). If adequate funds are not available on acceptable terms the Company may not be able to further develop its projects and it may impact on the Company's ability to continue as a going concern.

4.3 Industry specific

Environmental

The operations and proposed activities of the Company are subject to laws and regulations concerning the environment. As with most exploration projects and mining operations, the Company's activities are expected to have an impact on the environment, particularly if advanced exploration or mine development proceeds. It is the Company's intention to conduct its activities to the highest standard of environmental obligation, including compliance with all environmental laws.

Significant liabilities could be imposed on the Company for damages, clean-up costs or penalties in the event of certain discharges into the environment, environmental damage caused by previous operations or non-compliance with environmental laws or regulations.

4.4 General risks

Economic

General economic conditions, introduction of tax reform, new legislation, movements in interest and inflation rates and currency exchange rates may have an adverse effect on the Company's exploration, development and production activities, as well as on its ability to fund those activities.

Market conditions

Share market conditions may affect the value of the Company's quoted securities regardless of the Company's operating performance. Share market conditions are affected by many factors such as:

- (i) general economic outlook;
- (ii) introduction of tax reform or other new legislation;
- (iii) interest rates and inflation rates;
- (iv) changes in investor sentiment toward particular market sectors;
- (v) the demand for, and supply of, capital; and
- (vi) terrorism or other hostilities.

The market price of securities can fall as well as rise and may be subject to varied and unpredictable influences on the market for equities in general and resource exploration stocks in particular. Neither the Company nor the Directors warrant the future performance of the Company or any return on an investment in the Company.

Reliance on key personnel

The responsibility of overseeing the day-to-day operations and the strategic management of the Company depends substantially on its senior management and its key personnel. There can be no assurance given that there will be no detrimental impact on the Company if one or more of these employees cease their employment.

Speculative Nature of Investment

The above list of risk factors is not to be taken as exhaustive of the risks faced by the Company or by Shareholders in the Company. The above factors, and others not specifically referred to above, may in the future materially affect the financial performance of the Company and the value of the securities offered under this Prospectus.

Therefore, the Securities to be issued pursuant to this Prospectus carry no guarantee with respect to the payment of dividends, returns of capital or the market value of those Securities.

Potential investors should consider that the investment in the Company is speculative and should consult their professional advisers before deciding whether to apply for Securities in the Company.

5. RIGHTS AND LIABILITIES ATTACHING TO SHARES AND TERMS OF OPTIONS

5.1 Rights Attaching to Shares

The rights and liabilities attaching to Shares in the Company are:

- (a) set out in the Constitution of the Company, a copy of which can be inspected, free of charge, at the registered office of the Company during normal business hours; and
- (b) in certain circumstances, regulated by the Corporations Act, the Listing Rules and the general law.

The following is a summary of the more significant rights and liabilities attaching to the Shares. This summary is not exhaustive and does not constitute a definitive statement of the rights and liabilities of Shareholders. To obtain such a statement, persons should seek independent legal advice.

Voting Rights

Subject to any special rights or restrictions for the time being attached to any class or classes of Shares in the Company (at present there are none), at a general meeting every shareholder present in person or by proxy, attorney or representative will have on a show of hands one vote and, on a poll, one vote for each Share held.

General Meetings

Each shareholder is entitled to receive notice of, and to attend and vote at, general meetings of the Company and to receive all notices, financial reports and other documents required to be furnished to shareholders under the Constitution or the Corporations Act and the Listing Rules.

Dividend Rights

Subject to the rights of holders of any Shares created or raised under any special arrangement as to dividends (at present there are none), any dividend as declared shall be payable on all Shares in proportion to the amount of capital for the time being paid up or credited as paid up in respect of such Shares.

Rights on Winding-up

Subject to the rights of holders of Shares with special rights in a winding-up (at present there are none), on a winding-up of the Company all monies and property that are to be legally distributed among holders of Shares will be distributed in proportion to the amounts paid up (or which at the commencement of the winding-up ought to have been paid up) on those Shares compared with the total paid-up capital of the Company.

Transfer of Shares

Subject to the Constitution, the Corporations Act, the ASX Listing Rules and any other applicable laws of Australia, and subject to any restrictions applicable to Shares that have been designated by the ASX as "restricted securities", Shares are freely transferable.

Shareholder Liability

As Shares are fully paid shares, they are not subject to any calls for money by the Board and will therefore not become liable for forfeiture.

ASX Listing Rules

Despite anything in the constitution of the Company, if the Listing Rules prohibit an act being done, the act must not be done. Nothing in the constitution prevents an act being done that the Listing Rules require to be done. If the Listing Rules require an act to be done or not to be done, authority is given for that act to be done or not to be done (as the case may be). If the Listing Rules require the constitution to contain a provision or not to contain a provision the constitution is deemed to contain that provision or not to contain that provision (as the case may be). If a provision of the constitution is or becomes inconsistent with the Listing Rules, the constitution is deemed not to contain that provision to the extent of the inconsistency.

5.2 Rights Attaching to Options

The terms of the Options offered under this Prospectus are:

- (a) Each Option entitles the holder to subscribe for and be allotted one Share.
- (b) The Options may be exercisable at any time prior to 5:00pm WST on 31 December 2014 (**Expiry Date**). Options not exercised on or before the Expiry Date will automatically lapse.
- (c) The exercise price of each Option is 5 cents.
- (d) The Options may be exercised wholly or in part by completing an application form for Shares (**Notice of Exercise**) delivered to the Company's share registry and received by it any time prior to the Expiry Date.
- (e) The Options are transferable and the Company will apply to ASX to have the Options granted Official Quotation.
- (f) Upon the exercise of an Option and receipt of all relevant documents and payment, the holder will be allotted and issued a Share ranking pari passu with the then issued Shares. The Company will apply to ASX to have the Shares granted Official Quotation.
- (g) There will be no participating entitlement inherent in the Options to participate in new issues of capital which may be offered to Shareholders during the currency of the Options. Prior to any new pro rata issue of securities to Shareholders, Option holders will be notified by the Company in accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules.
- (h) There are no rights to a change in exercise price, or in the number of Shares over which the Options can be exercised, in the event of a bonus issue by the Company prior to the exercise of any Options.
- (i) In the event of any reconstruction (including consolidation, sub-division, reduction or return) of the issued capital of the Company prior to the Expiry Date, all rights of an Option holder are to be changed in a manner consistent with the Listing Rules.
- (j) Shares issued pursuant to the exercise of an Option will be issued not more than 14 days after the date of the Notice of Exercise.

6. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

6.1 Underwriting Agreement

On 18 July 2013, the Company and the Underwriter entered into the Underwriting Agreement pursuant to which the Underwriter agreed to underwrite the total amount of the Offer, being the Underwritten Amount.

The Company will pay the Underwriter a fee in respect of underwriting the Offer in an amount equal to 6% plus GST of the Underwritten Amount (that is, \$32,719 being 6% of \$545,312), exclusive of GST. The Underwriter is entitled to be reimbursed for all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses. As part of its fee, the Underwriter will also be issued 4,000,000 Options.

The Underwriting Agreement imposes obligations on the Company including an obligation to offer the Securities in accordance with regulatory requirements. The Underwriting Agreement further contains various representations and warranties made by the Company to the Underwriter that are customary for an agreement of this nature, including a right to terminate its underwriting commitment in the event of:

- a) A 10% or greater fall in the S&P / ASX 200 Index.

As part of the Underwriting Agreement, the Underwriter may appoint sub-underwriters on such terms as it thinks fit, not inconsistent with those in the Underwriting Agreement.

The Company has also entered into an agreement for the Underwriter to provide corporate advisory services for a six month period at a cost of \$2,500 per month.

Sub-Underwriting Agreements

The Underwriter has entered into sub-underwriting agreements with several parties including Mr Jurman and a director related entity of Mr Flint, Dellfield Holdings Pty Ltd.

Dellfield Holdings Pty Ltd, a company related to Mr Flint has agreed to sub-underwrite the issue of 2,000,000 Shares and 1,000,000 Options, and Mr Jurman has agreed to sub-underwrite the issue of 1,000,000 Shares and 500,000 Options.

Mr Flint (or his related entity) and Mr Jurman will be entitled to a sub-underwriting fee of 3% (payable by the Underwriter) for the amount they have sub-underwritten.

6.2 Relevant interest of Underwriter and Others

The Underwriter currently does not have a relevant interest in the issued Shares in the Company.

In the unlikely circumstances that all Shareholders (including Directors) decide to not take up their Entitlement and any sub-underwriters renege on their obligations to subscribe for Shortfall Securities and the Underwriting Agreement has not been terminated, the Underwriter would be issued with all the 21,812,500 Shortfall Shares (and attaching Options) and its relevant interest in Shares would represent approximately 33% at completion of the Offer.

The Underwriter has informed the Company that on the facts and circumstances presently known to it, it is supportive of the Company's current direction.

The Underwriter has advised the Company that since it is presently supportive of the Company's current direction, it does not currently intend to make any major changes to the

direction and objectives of the Company, and that other than as disclosed in this Prospectus, the Underwriter:

- (a) does not currently intend to make any changes to the existing business of the Company;
- (b) does not currently intend to inject further capital into the Company other than in underwriting the Offer;
- (c) does not currently intend to become involved in decisions regarding the future employment of the Company's present employees and contemplates that they will continue in the ordinary course of business;
- (d) does not currently intend for any property to be transferred between the Company and it or any person associated with it;
- (e) does not currently intend to redeploy the fixed assets of the Company; and
- (f) does not currently intend to change the Company's existing financial or dividend policies.

The Underwriter will ensure that any sub-underwriters will sub-underwrite on the basis that their relevant interest in Shares will not increase beyond 20%.

In the unlikely event that none of the other Shareholders take up their Entitlements, Dellfield Holdings Pty Ltd's (Mr Flint's related entity) relevant interest in the Shares of the Company, by reason of the right to subscribe for Securities pursuant to its Entitlement and to its sub-underwriting agreement, will increase by 2,311,250 Shares, resulting in an increase of its voting power from 1.43% to 4.48%.

Similarly, Mr Jurman's relevant interest in the Shares of the Company will increase by 1,212,500 Shares, which results in an increase of his voting power from 0.97% to 2.5%.

- (b) for services provided by a Director in connection with the formation or promotion of the Company or the Offer.
