SELECTED SPI200™ AND ISF® EXPIRY DATES

Participants and Vendors are advised that as stated in SFE Circular 33/01 and SFE Bulletin 74/01, the Exchange has revised the expiry dates of selected SPI 200™ and ISF® contracts. This is to maintain market consistency between the expiry dates of SFE and ASX individual equity derivative products and to provide a liquid environment for the expiry of index products.
