ACOJE NICKEL PROJECT – PHILIPPINES

MV Mustang Commences Loading At Santa Cruz Port

Rusina Mining NL (ASX: RML, AIM: RMLA) is pleased to announce the commencement of loading the MV Mustang vessel at DMCI's Santa Cruz Port.

Rusina's local partner DMCI has advised that the vessel arrived noon, on the 13th February and will load 6,500 wmt 1.6% Ni, 20-30% Fe for Chinese buyers. This dedicated ship is expected to continuously ship the higher value cargos between Acoje and China making maximum advantage of the Acoje's geographic advantage over other suppliers in the region.

DMCI has advised that the larger 50,000 tonne cargos (1.2 to 1.4% Ni) clearing the port stockpiles, should also be shipped over the next month. The mining operation at Acoje has now been reconfigured to supply >1.4% Ni grades continuously to the port to satisfy current market conditions.
