NEW LIVER SPECIALIST CLINIC AT MOUNT ELIZABETH HOSPITAL SINGAPORE

The **Asian Centre for Liver Diseases and Transplantation Limited (“ACLDT” or “the Company”)** wishes to announce that a new liver specialist clinic operated by the Company commenced operations today at Mount Elizabeth Centre, the largest private hospital in Singapore.

The new clinic, which will complement the main Liver Centre at Gleneagles Hospital in Singapore, will allow ACLDT to tap higher patient load and referrals from specialists at Mount Elizabeth. Both hospitals are part of the Parkway Holdings Limited, which has a network of 16 hospitals throughout Asia.

In July 2010 ACLDT announced that it had entered into a service agreement with Panasia Surgery Pte. Ltd. which is also located at Mount Elizabeth. Under the agreement – intended to increase patient referrals – ACLDT provides a consultant surgeon or surgeons to support Panasia’s operations in Singapore.

Outside Singapore, ACLDT also operates a satellite clinic in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam, and a specialist liver clinic in Seremban, Malaysia.

Since 2010 ACLDT has significantly strengthened its team of surgeons to support the lead surgeon Dato’ Dr Tan Kai Chah, who is also Executive Chairman of ACLDT. The new surgeons include liver transplant surgeon and cancer specialist Dr Tan Yu Meng and consultant gastroenterologist, Dr Vincent Lai Wai Kwan.
