### REVIEW & RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

Cassius Mining Limited is an African focused precious metals explorer (Ghana - Gold) and industrial mineral developer (Madagascar - Limestone).

The principal activities of the consolidated group during the financial period were mining, mine development, mineral exploration and seeking mining opportunities.

The net loss for the half-year ended 31 December 2020, after providing for income tax amounted to \$34,357 (31 December 2019: loss of \$5,080,275).

### EXPLORATION

The Company has refined its strategy for an initial 2021 drilling programme in Madagascar, with timing dependant on the Covid situation allowing that programme to safely proceed.

The Company continues to review opportunities to expand its portfolio where a significant benefit can be identified for its shareholders, with current negotiations underway on a potential Australian project.

### LITIGATION FUNDING

On 1 December 2020 the Company entered a litigation funding term sheet with Omni Bridgeway Limited which is subject to due diligence. Subject to successful due diligence, the parties will move to a binding agreement. Under the agreed terms Omni Bridgeway's costs will only be recoverable from any sum or material benefit the Company may receive as a result of the Claim being resolved by way of a court judgment, arbitration award, settlement or compromise.

### COVID-19 MANAGEMENT

The global economic outlook is facing uncertainty due to the current COVID-19 pandemic, which has been having, and is likely to continue to have, a significant impact on global capital markets.

To date, COVID-19 has not had any material impact on the Company's operations other than in Madagascar where this country is in lockdown and will limit our exploration activities.

Supply chain disruptions resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic and measures implemented by governmental authorities around the world to limit the transmission of the virus (such as travel bans and quarantining) may, in addition to the general level of economic uncertainty caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, also adversely impact the Company's operations, financial position and prospects.

The Company has implemented a COVID-19 management plan across its business in order to minimise the risk of infection for individuals. This includes personnel working remotely so as to reduce the frequency of travel.

The Company's COVID-19 management plan will be reviewed and updated based on the latest guidance from health professionals and the government as the situation develops.

### EVENTS SUBSEQUENT TO REPORTING DATE

There are no known events subsequent to balance date that would have a material effect on these financial statements and there have been no material impact from COVID-19 after balance date.

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## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

### 1. Basis of Preparation

The half-year consolidated financial statements of Cassius Mining Ltd are a general purpose financial report prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Corporations Act 2001*, Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134: Interim Financial Reporting and other Australian Accounting Standards which ensure compliance with International Financial Reporting Standards.

This interim financial report is intended to provide users with an update on the latest annual financial statements of Cassius Mining Limited and its controlled entities (the group).

It is recommended that this financial report be read in conjunction with the annual financial report of the group for the year ended 30 June 2020 and any public announcements made during the half-year in accordance with continuous disclosure requirements arising under the *Corporations Act 2001*.

The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the entities in the consolidated group and are consistent with those in the June 2020 financial report.

The half-year report does not include full disclosures of the type normally included in an annual financial report.

### Reporting Basis and Conventions

The half-year report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historical costs modified by the revaluation of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities for which the fair value basis of accounting has been applied.

### New and Amending Accounting Standards and Interpretations

The accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the half year report are consistent with those followed in the preparation of the consolidated entity's annual financial statements for the year ended 30 June 2020, except for the mandatory adoption of new standards and interpretations. The adoption of these standards and interpretations did not have any material impact on the financial position or the performance of the Group.

### Going Concern

The accounts have been prepared on the going concern basis, which contemplates continuity of normal business activities and the realisation of assets and liabilities in the normal course of business.

The Directors are aware that the Group's ability to continue as a going concern, and its ability to pay its debts as and when they fall due, is largely dependent on successfully managing its short to medium term liquidity position.

## Report on the Half-Year Financial Report

## Emphasis of Matter Relating to Going Concern

Without qualifying our opinion, we draw attention to Note 1 in the financial report regarding going concern. The group incurred a net loss of \$34,357 for the half year ended 31 December 2020 and as of that date, had cash at bank of \$51,284, current assets of \$52,437, current liabilities of \$20,633 and total equity of \$949,260. These conditions, along with other matters detailed in Note 1, indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast doubt on the group's ability to continue as a going concern.

## Conclusions

Based on our review, which is not an audit, we have not become aware of any matter that makes us believe that the half-year financial report of Cassius Mining Limited and controlled entities is not in accordance with the *Corporations Act 2001* including:

- (i) giving a true and fair view of the consolidated entity's financial position as at 31 December 2020 and of its performance for the half-year ended on that date; and
