#### Comments

The loss for the Group after providing for income tax amounted to \$2,664,912 (31 December 2021: \$1,990,815).

Revenues decreased 9.8 % compared to 1H22 primarily due to planned downtime in 1H23 at both activated carbon plants to install updated equipment which resulted in lower production and sales than typical for the period.

The directors consider Underlying Earnings Before Interest, Tax, Depreciation and Amortisation ('EBITDA') and Underlying EBIT to reflect the core earnings of the Group. 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# Carbonxt Group Limited Directors' report 31 December 2022



The directors present their report, together with the financial statements, on the consolidated entity (referred to hereafter as the 'Group') consisting of Carbonxt Group Limited (referred to hereafter as the 'Company' or 'parent entity') and the entities it controlled at the end of, or during, the half-year ended 31 December 2022.

### **Directors**

The following persons were directors of Carbonxt Group Limited during the whole of the financial half-year and up to the date of this report, unless otherwise stated:

Matthew Driscoll - Chairman

David Mazvck

Fadi Diab (appointed 8 September 2022 and resigned 29 November 2022)

### **Principal activities**

During the financial half-year the principal continuing activities of the Group consisted of the development and sale of specialised Activated Carbon ('AC') products, including Powdered Activated Carbon ('PAC') and AC pellets for the removal of pollutants and toxins in industrial processes.

These products are used in industrial air purification, waste water treatment and other liquid and gas phase markets, primarily for the capture of mercury and sulphur in order to reduce harmful emissions into the atmosphere, as required by global regulations.

### Review of operations

The loss for the Group after providing for income tax amounted to \$2,664,912 (31 December 2021: \$1,990,815).

Revenue for the half-year was \$8,912,406 representing a decrease of 9.8% on the prior half-year's revenue of \$9,885,160.

Revenues decreased 9.8 % compared to 1H22 primarily due to planned downtime in 1H23 at both activated carbon plants to install updated equipment which resulted in lower production and sales than typical for the period.

The directors consider Underlying Earnings Before Interest, Tax, Depreciation and Amortisation ('EBITDA') and Underlying EBIT to reflect the core earnings of the Group. Underlying EBITDA and underlying EBIT are financial measures which are not prescribed by Australian Accounting Standards ('AAS') and represent the profit or loss under AAS adjusted for non-cash and significant items. As a result of the loss incurred for the half year ended 31 December 2022 and the liquidity at the reporting date, there is a material uncertainty on whether the Group can continue as a going concern. The directors consider that the Group will continue as a going concern, as explained in note 2 to the financial statements.

## Significant changes in the state of affairs

Capital raising

On 29 July 2022, the Company signed a term sheet for the 50% ownership in a new state-of-the-art activated carbon plant located in Eastern Kentucky, USA in a joint venture with KCP, an established and leading industry player that is well capitalised and well connected in the US market ('Joint Venture').

On 2 August 2022, the Group announced the successful completion of institutional entitlement offer raising approximately \$400,888 (before issue cost) from 2,863,483 ordinary shares at an issue price of \$0.14. The shares were issued on 10 August 2022.

On 26 September 2022, the Group announced the commitment to raise \$7,000,000 through the placement of 70,000,000 fully paid shares at \$0.10 per share before issue costs in two tranches. The tranche 1 shares of 13,114,383 were issued at \$0.10 per share raising a total of \$1,311,719 before issue costs. The issuance of tranche 2 was approved by shareholders in the AGM, a total of 51,742,810 shares were issued at \$0.10 per share raising a total of \$5,174,281 before issue costs. Total amount raised on the share placement is \$6,486,000 before issue costs.

On 30 September 2022, the Company announced the share purchase plan to provide existing shareholders as at 23 September 2022, the opportunity to subscribe for new shares at the offer price of \$0.10 per share. A total of 16,103,000 shares were issued under the share purchase plan and raised a total of \$1,610,300. The shares were issued on 3 November 2022.

## Borrowing facility

On 14 December 2022, the Company signed an agreement with Pure Asset Management ('Pure') to amend and restate the existing loan facility. Under the amended and restated loan facility agreement, Pure would provide the Company with a \$15,000,000 facility which will be used to pay back the existing loan (\$5,394,451) and the remaining amount will be used to fund the KCP Joint Venture, acquisitions and product development, and for working capital purposes. The new loan facility is conditional upon satisfaction of conditions precedent, including but not limited to a duly executed KCP Joint Venture Agreement. As of the date of this report, the KCP Joint Venture agreement has not been finalised.

There were no other significant changes in the state of affairs of the Group during the financial half-year.

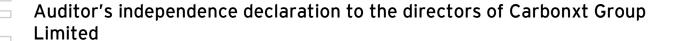

#### Note 1. General information

The financial statements cover Carbonxt Group Limited as a Group consisting of Carbonxt Group Limited ('Company' or 'parent entity') and the entities it controlled at the end of, or during, the half-year (referred to in these financial statements as the 'Group'). The financial statements are presented in Australian dollars, which is Carbonxt Group Limited's functional and presentation currency.

Carbonxt Group Limited is a listed public company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in Australia. Its registered office and principal place of business are:

A description of the nature of the Group's operations and its principal activities are included in the directors' report, which is not part of the financial statements.

The financial statements were authorised for issue, in accordance with a resolution of directors, on 28 February 2023.

# Note 2. Significant accounting policies

These general purpose financial statements for the interim half-year reporting period ended 31 December 2022 have been prepared in accordance with Australian Accounting Standard AASB 134 'Interim Financial Reporting' and the Corporations Act 2001, as appropriate for for-profit oriented entities. Compliance with AASB 134 ensures compliance with International Financial Reporting Standard IAS 34 'Interim Financial Reporting'.

These general purpose financial statements do not include all the notes of the type normally included in annual financial statements. Accordingly, these financial statements are to be read in conjunction with the annual report for the year ended 30 June 2022 and any public announcements made by the Company during the interim reporting period in accordance with the continuous disclosure requirements arising under Australian Securities Exchange Listing Rules and the Corporations Act 2001.

The principal accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year and corresponding interim reporting period, unless otherwise stated.

### New or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations adopted

The Group has adopted all of the new or amended Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the Australian Accounting Standards Board ('AASB') that are mandatory for the current reporting period. The adoption of these Accounting Standards and Interpretations did not have any significant impact on the financial performance or position of the Group during the financial half-year ended 31 December 2022 and are not expected to have significant impact for the full financial year ending 30 June 2023.

Any new or amended Accounting Standards or Interpretations that are not yet mandatory have not been early adopted.

#### Going concern

The Group incurred a loss after tax of \$2,664,912 (31 December 2021: \$1,990,815) and operating cash outflows of \$1,431,777 (31 December 2021: inflows of \$60,672) for the half year ended 31 December 2022. At 31 December 2022, cash and cash equivalents were \$6,165,188 (30 June 2022: \$1,090,450) and net current assets of \$1,840,949 (30 June 2022: net current liabilities of \$3,583,320).

The Directors, in their consideration of the appropriateness of the going concern basis for the preparation of the financial statements, have prepared a cash flow forecast through to June 2024 which requires the Group to obtain ongoing support from lenders which would not require repayment of borrowings of \$5,394,451 in May 2023 (see note 9), generate positive cash flows from operations or be able to raise capital to have sufficient cash to continue as a going concern. This results in a material uncertainty that may cast significant doubt about the Group's ability to continue as a going concern.



## Note 2. Significant accounting policies (continued)

At the date of signing this report, the Directors have reasonable grounds to believe the Group will be able to achieve the matters noted above and that it is appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

Should the Group not achieve the above matters, it maybe required to realise its assets and extinguish its liabilities other than in the normal course of business and at the amounts that differ from those stated in the financial statements. The financial statements do not include any adjustments relating to the recoverability or classification of recorded asset amounts or to the amounts or classification of liabilities that might be necessary should the Group not be able to continue as a going concern.

## Note 3. Operating segments

## Identification of reportable operating segments

The Group only has one reportable segment being the development and sale of specialised Activated Carbon ('AC') products, principally in the United States of America. This is based on the internal reports that are reviewed and used by the Board of Directors (who are identified as the Chief Operating Decision Makers ('CODM')) in assessing performance and in determining the allocation of resources. There is no aggregation of operating segments.

The information reported to the CODM is on a monthly basis.

# Conclusion
