Independent assessment of ASX's Assurance Program for the CHESS Replacement Project

Fifth Six-Monthly Progress Report - Public Release

17 December 2024

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## 1. Executive Summary

### 1.1 Introduction

#### **CHESS Replacement Project**

CHESS is used by ASX as a core system to perform clearing, settlement and other post-trade services for the Australian equity market. ASX is undertaking a project to replace with a new technology solution ('CHESS Replacement Project').

In November 2023, ASX announced that it had completed its reassessment of the solution design to replace CHESS and would proceed with a product-based solution to be delivered by a global technology provider. ASX proposed to implement the new platform in two main releases, with the clearing component to be delivered in a first release, and the settlement and sub-register components to follow in a second release.

The indicative timeframe for implementation of the clearing component ('Release 1') is 2026. On 26 November 2024, following extensive industry consultation on scope and timing, ASX announced its implementation plan for the settlement and sub-register services ('Release 2') of the CHESS system with implementation targeted for 2029.

### ASX Assurance Program over CHESS Replacement Project

In June 2024, the ASX Assurance Program over the CHESS Replacement Project ('ASX Assurance Plan') was approved through ASX governance processes, to support the CHESS Replacement Project in meeting its primary objective of the successful replacement and decommissioning of the current CHESS system.

On 28 June 2024, we issued the report on the design assessment of the ASX Assurance Plan and concluded that it was fit-for-purpose.

For our design assessment, we defined 'fit-for-purpose' as the extent to which the coverage of the material CHESS Replacement Project risks and deliverables, and the nature, extent, timing and sequencing of assurance activities, and governance and change management of the ASX Assurance Plan, are suitable for the size and complexity of the CHESS Replacement Project.

## 1.2 Scope

#### Licence Conditions and EY Independent Expert role

In November 2021, ASIC imposed certain Licence Conditions on ASX Clear Pty Ltd and ASX Settlement Pty Ltd which included the appointment of an independent expert to assess the ASX Assurance Program and oversee the implementation of any remedial actions from the trade outage independent expert review recommendations which are relevant to the CHESS Replacement Project.

### This Report

The objective of this report is to evaluate the governance processes over the ASX Assurance Plan and to assess the appropriateness of the completed ASX assurance activities for the implementation of the CHESS Replacement Project to determine whether the ASX Assurance Plan continues to be fit for purpose.

This report is our seventh independent expert report under the Licence Conditions and our fifth six-monthly progress report.

## 1.3 Approach

We interviewed assurance providers, including the primary assurance provider, ASX Delivery Assurance, and ASX Internal Audit to assess the scope, approach, assurance provider team composition, and timing of the assurance activities.

We reviewed the assurance artefacts, including for the completed assurance activities to assess whether the deliverables and level of detail were clearly defined and findings and recommendations were appropriate, whether the remedial actions from historical reviews have been considered in the assurance reviews, and whether the Assurance Plan activities during the period were appropriately performed and planned at the appropriate time and linked to appropriate CHESS Replacement Project milestones to address the material CHESS Replacement Project risks.

We inspected artefacts related to the conflict-of-interest processes to assess whether independence of assurance providers have been identified, assessed, managed and reported ('show me').

We reviewed governance papers and held interviews with key ASX and external stakeholders to gain an understanding of the key CHESS Replacement Project updates, including timeline, the management and monitoring of the ASX Assurance Plan and assurance activities, as well as reporting and closure of findings and recommendations raised by ASX assurance reviews, and the alignment of CHESS Replacement Project risks to assurance activities.

### 1.4 Our Conclusion

Based on the procedures performed, our assessment found that the governance mechanisms over the ASX Assurance Plan and the assurance activities in this Report period were fit for purpose.

We have no recommendations in this Report for the ASX Assurance Plan.

## 1.5 Our Assessment Summary

► Governance over the ASX Assurance Plan - Our assessment found that the ASX Assurance Plan governance processes are appropriate.

Our assessment of the appropriateness of the governance over the ASX Assurance Plan included the evaluation of the following attributes:

- 1.A. ASX Assurance Plan activities against the CHESS Replacement Project milestones.
- 1.B. Progress of assurance activities against the planned timelines.
- 1.C. Change management process over the ASX Assurance Plan.
- 1.D. Monitoring and reporting processes for the ASX Assurance Plan.
- 1.E. Governance processes over agreed management actions and closure of findings raised by assurance reviews.
- 1.F. Ongoing evaluation of the assurance providers' independence.
- 1.G. Remedial actions from historical reviews.

The ASX Assurance Plan is dynamic in nature. We assessed the updates to the Assurance Plan including any changes to the proposed timing of assurance activities and the CHESS Replacement Project milestones they are anchored to.

Our assessment found that adjustments made in the timing of ASX Assurance Plan reviews and linked CHESS Replacement Project milestones were supported by an adequate rationale in accordance with the movements in CHESS Replacement Project timelines.

There was a delay in appointing the primary assurance provider which delayed the start of the assurance reviews performed by the primary assurance provider. While this resulted in compressed timelines for the assurance reviews, several assurance reviews were concurrently performed by different assurance provider teams to meet timelines. Our assessment found that the assurance reviews planned were completed against the CHESS Replacement Project milestones they were anchored to.

and observed the meeting held 29 November 2024. We found that ASX has appropriate processes in place for key aspects surrounding the governance and maintenance of the ASX Assurance Plan, including definition of roles and responsibilities, periodic review and approvals, reporting of progress and escalation process,

changes to review timings, monitoring of findings raised by completed assurance activities and ongoing management of independence and conflicts of interest.

**Completed ASX Assurance Plan assurance reviews** - Our assessment of the eight ASX assurance reviews completed in this cycle did not identify material exceptions.

Our assessment of the appropriateness of reviews included the evaluation of the eight ASX Assurance Plan review appropriateness for the following attributes:

- 2.A. Scope aligns to the ASX Assurance Plan,
- 2.B. Approach is reasonable to achieve scope,
- 2.C. Capacity and capability of team match scope and approach,
- 2.D. Deliverables and level of detail are clearly defined, and
- 2.E. Appropriateness and relevance of findings and recommendations in relation to the procedures executed and the risks intended to be covered.

#### Next steps

Our next report under the Licence Condition is due on 30 June 2025.

The scope of that report will cover the completed Release 1 assurance activities, the ASX Assurance Plan annual refresh, and the design of the ASX Assurance Plan covering CHESS Replacement Project activities for Release 2.

We will assess the detailed scope and the outcome of the completed reviews, including the five currently inflight, and any closure of recommendation actions from the ASX assurance activities during the period.

We will continue to closely monitor changes to the ASX Assurance plan.

Refer to Appendix B for the list of ASX assurance reviews we plan to assess in our next six-monthly report per the latest version of the Assurance Plan included in Appendix A.

We acknowledge and thank ASX for its cooperation in undertaking our independent assessment activities to date.

### 2. Introduction

## 2.1 Background

#### CHESS Replacement Project and the ASX Assurance Plan

In November 2023, ASX announced it would proceed with a product-based solution design to replace CHESS. A global technology provider was chosen to deliver the solution using a product which offers a modular technology platform for clearing and settlement services. Given the scale and complexity of the CHESS Replacement Project, an external party was chosen as solution integrator to provide additional capability, capacity and industry expertise.

ASX are planning to implement the new platform in two main releases. This staged approach is expected to reduce overall delivery risk and should help manage impacts on stakeholders, as compared to a single release. Release 1 will be clearing services, with settlement and subregister services to follow in Release 2. Work is underway on both releases, which are planned to be deployed on cloud-based services selected by ASX.

The ASX Assurance Plan was approved through ASX governance processes in June 2024. The Assurance Plan was based on the current level of information available for the CHESS Replacement Project Release 1 and Release 2, covering Release 1 activities to 2026 go-live and Release 2 activities focused on CHESS Replacement Project anchor milestones up to December 2024.

In the 11 September 2024 Technical Committee meeting the following were communicated:

► The primary assurance provider has been appointed.

In the 9 October 2024 Technical Committee meeting, the following were communicated:

- The CHESS Replacement Project is tracking Amber due to delays in Product Acceptance Testing (PAT) and the Data Platform build for CHESS replacement.
- The primary assurance provider has been onboarded and commenced assurance activities as per the Assurance Plan presented at the August Technical Committee.

In the 6 November 2024, Technical Committee meeting, the following were communicated:

- ► The CHESS Replacement Project is still reported as Amber due to the delays in System Integration testing (SIT) for Drop 1 and the Data Platform build.
- Five assurance reviews commenced in mid-September 2024.
- ► Two assurance reviews were finalised in October 2024 with no risks or issues being reported.

In the 3 December 2024 Technical Committee Paper, the following were communicated:

- ► The CHESS Replacement Project is still reported as Amber due to the delays in testing and the Data and Reporting Platform build for CHESS Replacement..
- Nine assurance reviews, including the June 2024 Independent Expert Report, have been completed at the end of November 2024.

The completed assurance reviews were performed by the primary assurance provider, another external assurance provider, ASX delivery assurance team, and ASX internal audit.

The outcomes of individual reviews planned in the ASX Assurance Plan, and their findings are tracked by the ASX Assurance Plan workstream within the CHESS Replacement Project and reported periodically to the required ASX and project governance forums. Refer to Appendix C for

the list of assurance reviews completed and the results thereof reported in the December 2024 Technical Committee meeting.

At the date of this report, there were five inflight ASX assurance reviews and one review in planning stage (CHESS replacement application review Release 1 - Design Effectiveness). We will assess these once they have been completed and include our findings in future reports:

- 1. Release 1 Requirements and design processes;
- 2. ASX test policy and standards assessment for Release 1 (Stage 2: Test plans and test execution activities);
- 3. Release 1 Resiliency, Capacity & Performance review (Part 1: design review and test approach / plan);
- 4. Release 1 System security requirements review (Part 1: security design review); and
- 5. Release 1 System security requirements review (Part 2: validation of security requirements implementation in industry test environment).

ASX will perform an annual assessment of the ASX Assurance Plan to maintain its relevance and alignment to key CHESS Replacement Project risks, including key changes to the CHESS Replacement Project and the CHESS Replacement Project risk profile, progress against CHESS Replacement Project timeframes, milestones and implementation activities, and alignment with ASX management and external stakeholder input. Any changes to the ASX Assurance Plan arising from the annual refresh will be agreed through the PAF and reported to the relevant governance forums. This is planned to be performed in FYQ4 2025.

#### ASX Clear and ASX Settlement Licence conditions

As a related matter, in November 2020 an outage occurred following a major upgrade to ASX's equity trading platform (ASX Trade), called the ASX Trade Refresh project. Consequently, the Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) and the Reserve Bank of Australia (RBA) required an independent expert review of the ASX Trade Refresh project to be completed. The independent expert made recommendations in seven key categories from this review: risk, governance, delivery, requirements, vendor management, testing and incident management

(collectively the trade outage independent expert review recommendations).

The combination of the trade outage and the criticality of the CHESS Replacement Project has led ASIC (as delegate for the Minister) to impose certain Licence Conditions on ASX Clear and ASX Settlement. Australian CS Facility Licence (ASX Clear Pty Limited) Additional Conditions Notice 2021 (No.1) dated 24 November 2021 and Australian CS Facility Licence (ASX Settlement Pty Limited) Additional Conditions Notice 2021 (No.1) dated 24 November 2021, condition 2 on Schedule 1 "Appointment of an independent expert" required ASX to engage an independent third party (independent expert) to conduct an assessment of its existing ASX Assurance Program on its CHESS Replacement Project prior to Go-Live and oversee the implementation of any remedial actions from the trade outage independent expert review recommendations which are relevant to the CHESS Replacement Project. ASX subsequently appointed EY as the independent expert on 21 December 2021.

With the objective of providing confidence to the efficient and effective future operation of Australia's financial markets infrastructure, the Licence Conditions are directed at mitigating risks with emphasis on the oversight of the CHESS Replacement Project and require EY as independent expert to assess whether the ASX Assurance Plan for the replacement of CHESS is designed and operating effectively with regular (6 monthly) reporting to ASIC.

### 2.2 Scope

In accordance with the relevant Licence Conditions, EY has been engaged to assess the ASX Assurance Plan and oversee the implementation of any remedial actions from the trade outage independent expert review recommendations which are relevant to the CHESS Replacement Project.

The objective of this report is to assess whether the governance process in place for the ASX Assurance Plan was sufficient and the completed assurance activities for the implementation of the CHESS Replacement

Project were appropriately performed. Our procedures to evaluate the appropriateness of the activities during this cycle included an assessment of the following aspects:

- 1. Governance over the ASX Assurance Plan
  - 1.A. ASX Assurance Plan activities against the CHESS Replacement Project milestones. Assessing whether assurance activities have been appropriately linked and executed with CHESS Replacement Project milestones.
  - 1.B. Progress of assurance activities against the planned timelines. Evaluating whether the assurance activities were scheduled, executed and completed at the right time in alignment to when the associated CHESS Replacement Project risks are more relevant.
  - 1.C. Change management process over the ASX Assurance Plan.
    Assessing whether changes to the ASX Assurance Plan, such as scope and schedule and topics, were raised to and approved by the appropriate governance forum.
  - 1.D. Monitoring and reporting processes for the ASX Assurance Plan. Determining whether appropriate governance forums are in place and the assurance activities are reported and monitored appropriately following the established mechanisms.
  - 1.E. Governance processes over agreed management actions and closure of findings raised by assurance reviews. Assessing whether management actions and findings raised by assurance reviews are tracked and closed by the ASX Assurance Plan appropriately.
  - 1.F. Ongoing evaluation of the assurance providers' independence. Determining whether appropriate conflict of interest assessment processes are implemented and executed to identify, assess, manage and report regarding the independence of assurance providers.

1.G. Remedial actions from historical reviews. Assessing whether the remedial actions from historical reviews have been considered in the performance of the assurance activities.

#### 2. Completed ASX Assurance Plan Reviews

- 2.A. Scope aligns to the ASX Assurance Plan. Assessing the appropriateness of the detailed scope of the assurance review in alignment to the objectives of the ASX Assurance Plan regarding key topics and CHESS Replacement Project risks coverage.
- 2.B. Approach is reasonable to achieve the scope. Assessing individual review procedures to determine whether the nature and extent of the procedures are appropriate to achieve the expectations and objectives of the review.
- 2.C. Capacity and capability of team match scope and approach.
  Assessing the capacity, capability of the assurance provider that performed the individual assurance review to determine whether they are commensurate with the requirements of the individual review performed.
- 2.D. **Deliverables and level of detail are clearly defined.** Assessing whether deliverables are clearly documented.
- 2.E. Appropriateness and relevance of findings and recommendations in relation to the procedures executed and the risks intended to be covered. Assessing whether the findings and recommendations identified are relevant to the risks intended to be covered by the assurance review and procedures performed.

## 2.3 Approach

In undertaking our assessment for the delivery of this report, the following activities were performed:

1. Show me documentation: A detailed assessment and analysis of the completed ASX Assurance Plan reviews and related artefacts including

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documentation was provided to EY by ASX based on a documentation request or were available to the public through the ASX website. A list of documentation assessed can be found in Appendix D.

2. Tell me Interviews with key stakeholders: The assessment involved stakeholder interviews and attending Business Committee and Technical Committee meetings to capture additional input to complement the analysis of the documentation provided and enhance our understanding. Key stakeholders identified were asked about their role with respect to the CHESS Replacement Project and the ASX Assurance Plan and their perspectives around the execution of the ASX Assurance Plan reviews including the coverage of key CHESS Replacement Project risks and the expected levels of assurance to be provided.

EY have grouped stakeholders into the following cohorts:

- ASX Board representatives
- CHESS Replacement Project governance members, accountable and responsible executives
- ASX Assurance Plan governance members, accountable and responsible executives
- ASX Assurance Plan assurance providers
- CHESS Replacement third party providers global technology provider and the solution integrator.
- Voice of the customer Approved Market Operators ('AMOs') and Business Committee and Technical Committee observation and papers.

A list of interviews conducted with key stakeholders can be found in Appendix D.

For this assessment, EY conducted bilateral meetings with AMO representatives, as they are the most immediately impacted market participants for Release 1. EY will continue to seek external views for our future reports on a six-monthly basis.

### 2.4 Limitations

- Our assessment was limited to documents requested by EY and provided by ASX as deemed relevant in line with the agreed scope and EY requests, with the expectation that ASX had those artefacts documented to satisfy its own governance arrangements and executive accountability needs.
- Our scope under the licence conditions requires us to oversee the implementation of any remedial actions from the trade outage Independent Expert review recommendations which are relevant to the CHESS Replacement Project. For the purpose of our engagement, we define oversee as to observe, inspect and test that ASX has considered the remedial actions in the ASX Assurance Plan. ASX are accountable and responsible for the implementation activities and EY will not act as management or direct the implementation.
- Our scope did not include a review of the primary assurance provider request for proposal (RFP) and appointment process managed by ASX.

## 3. Findings and Recommendations

Detailed in sections 3.1 through 3.2 are the findings and recommendations in relation to our assessment of the governance of the ASX Assurance Plan and the completed assurance reviews.

### 3.1 Governance over the ASX Assurance Plan

The objective of this area it to assess the established governance of the ASX Assurance Plan including change management and ongoing maintenance to determine whether adequate mechanisms have been established in place for a rigorous governance around the ASX Assurance Plan activities. This included an assessment of the changes to the proposed timing of the assurance reviews to determine whether they have been scheduled at the right time in alignment to when the associated CHESS Replacement Project risks are more relevant, so that they continue to be executed at the right time to provide the assurance inputs expected.

Our procedures included assessments of the following:

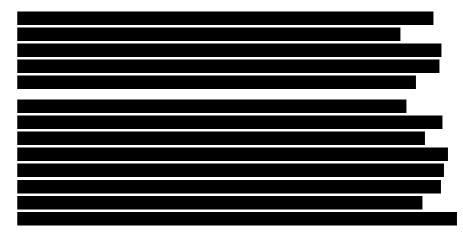
- 1.A. ASX Assurance Plan activities against the CHESS Replacement Project milestones.
- 1.B. Progress of assurance activities against the planned timelines.
- 1.C. Change management process over the ASX Assurance Plan.
- 1.D. Monitoring and reporting processes for the ASX Assurance Plan.
- 1.E. Governance processes over agreed management actions and closure of findings raised by assurance reviews.
- 1.F. Ongoing evaluation of the assurance providers' independence.
- 1.G. Remedial actions from historical reviews.

#### Context

is accountable for the ASX Assurance Plan.
A dedicated resource is assigned to perform day-to-day operational activities of the ASX Assurance Plan.

The PAF meets on a monthly basis and is accountable for steering the successful development and delivery of the ASX Assurance Plan for the duration of the CHESS Replacement Project. The PAF's accountabilities include:

- Ensuring assurance review topics are aligned to material risk and key project timing.
- Approving the scope of work, assurance providers, and timing for each review.
- Overseeing that appropriate action plans are developed and completed to address findings from reviews.
- Approving any changes to the ASX Assurance Plan, such as changes to scope and schedule, topics and agreed action plans.



The ASX Assurance Plan provides updates to the ASX Business Committee.

The ASX Assurance Plan will be refreshed on an annual basis, commencing early 2025, to remain current and aligned to key risks in the CHESS Replacement Project. Any changes to the ASX Assurance Plan as a result of the annual refresh will be agreed through the governance forums.

#### **Findings**

Our assessment found no material exceptions in the current processes in place for the governance and change management of the ASX Assurance Plan, including the adjustments to timing for future reviews.

As the CHESS Replacement Project ramps up its activities in the next six months, including opening the Industry Test Environment (ITE) to AMOs for AMO Build and Test in the first quarter of 2025, the ASX Assurance Plan activities will cover scopes with increased complexity and risks of the CHESS Replacement Project. We will continue to assess the governance processes over the assurance activities in our next sixmonthly reports.

## 1.A - The ASX Assurance Plan activities against the CHESS Replacement Project milestones

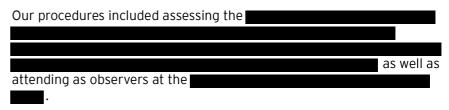
We assessed the ASX Assurance Plan and the changes to the proposed timing and to the milestones mapped to the assurance activities.

One key aspect considered by the ASX Assurance Plan in modifying the proposed timing for assurance reviews was the movements in the CHESS Replacement Project schedule and planned milestones. The ASX Assurance Plan also performed re-assessments on when meaningful inputs can be provided by the CHESS Replacement Project to the assurance reviews and adapted that into the updated proposed timing of the assurance reviews.

## 1.B - The progress of assurance activities against the planned timelines

We assessed the completed assurance reviews against the planned timelines and found that while there was a delay in appointing the primary assurance provider, the planned assurance reviews met the mapped milestones for the 8 completed reviews. While the timelines of the ASX Assurance Plan reviews performed by the primary assurance provider were compressed, we found the different primary assurance provider teams worked concurrently to complete the reviews without reducing the scope.

# 1.C & 1.D - The change management process and the monitoring and reporting processes for the ASX Assurance Plan to the governance forums



Since the ASX Assurance Plan was first approved in June 2024, there were changes made to the assurance review timing, scope and anchored CHESS Replacement Project milestones. Changes to the ASX Assurance Plan, including the ones below,

a. Timing of Release 1 ASX Industry Test Approach and planning which was performed from September to November 2024 instead of the indicative timing of August to September 2024.

- b. Timing of the Release 1 Requirements and design processes was adjusted to October to December 2024 from the indicative timing of September to October 2024.
- c. Another external assurance provider will perform Data Migration reviews instead of the Primary Assurance Provider.
- d. Timing and scope of the Resiliency review (Part 1: design review and test approach / plan) and Performance and scalability review (Part 1: design review and test approach / plan) have been merged into Release 1 Resiliency, Capacity & Performance review (Part 1: design review and test approach / plan).
- e. The indicative timing of the Release 1 System security requirements review (Part 1: security design review) and Release 1 System security requirements review (Part 2: validation of security requirements implementation in industry test environment) were changed and the end date for both reviews have extended.

We found that ASX has a formal process for the following key aspects surrounding the governance and maintenance of the ASX Assurance Plan:

- a. Roles and responsibilities in relation with the ASX Assurance Plan and its maintenance, including ownership, day-to-day operational activities, and governance forums.
- b. The process of maintaining the ASX Assurance Plan, including frequency of periodic review and approvals required for changes to the ASX Assurance Plan such as scope and timing.
- c. Reporting of progress and escalation in relation to the ASX Assurance Plan, including reporting to the
- d. Requirement for the assurance providers to manage independence and conflicts of interest.

## 1.E - The governance processes over agreed management actions and closure of findings raised by assurance reviews

We assessed whether the management actions and timelines, in response to the recommendations, are appropriate and whether these management actions are appropriately tracked and closed. At the time of drafting this report, assurance providers had identified findings and recommendations for five of eight completed assurance reviews.

For this report we assessed the management actions for two out of six reviews with findings raised which were either addressed by the CHESS Replacement Project following finalisation of the review (Light Health Check (Sentiment Survey) or prior to finalisation of the review (ASX Delivery Assurance Inflight Review 1 - Release 1). The assurance providers confirmed that the closure was appropriate and we assessed the closure process, including through inspecting the underlying evidence for appropriateness.

When management actions for findings in other reviews completed in this Report period are defined, we will assess how the ASX Assurance Plan tracks and closes findings and recommendations.

### <u>1.F - The ongoing evaluation of the assurance providers' independence</u>

We assessed ASX's processes in place to evaluate the independence of assurance providers, including understanding the criteria used by ASX's Enterprise Compliance team in the evaluation of conflict of interest and, for a sample of one assurance provider, obtaining evidence to corroborate that a conflict of interest assessment was performed.

For the review completed by ASX Internal Audit, we inspected the to confirm that conflict of interest checks were performed to assess independence. For the review completed by ASX Delivery Assurance, we assessed the independence through understanding the roles of the Delivery Assurance function.

As the primary and other external and internal assurance providers perform the assurance reviews, we will continue to evaluate ASX's

processes in identifying, assessing, managing and reporting the assurance providers' independence.

# 1.G - Assessment of whether the ASX Assurance Plan considered the remedial actions from historical reviews in the performance of the assurance activities

Our assessment included assessing the completed assurance reviews to determine whether they have considered the remedial actions from historical reviews in the performance of their procedures.

We found no material exceptions.

## 3.2 Completed ASX Assurance Plan Reviews

#### Context

The objective of this area is to assess whether the completed ASX Assurance Plan reviews addressed the following attributes:

- 2.A. Scope aligns to the ASX Assurance Plan
- 2.B. Approach is reasonable to achieve scope,
- 2.C. Capacity and capability of team match scope and approach,
- 2.D. Deliverables and level of detail are clearly defined, and
- 2.E. Appropriateness and relevance of findings and recommendations in relation to the procedures executed and the risks intended to be covered.

### **Findings**

Our assessment found no material exceptions.

### 2.A Scope aligns to the ASX Assurance Plan.

Our assessment found that the detailed scope of the assurance reviews were appropriate and aligned to the objectives of the ASX Assurance Plan and CHESS Replacement Project risks coverage.

There are a number of reviews for which the coverage of the scope will be tested iteratively, such as ASX Test Policy and standards assessment for Release 1 (3 stages), Cloud Platform Review (3 Parts) and Project Health Check Review (3 parts).

Where the scope coverages are split into different reviews, we will focus on the scope coverage to assess their appropriateness and completeness in our next six-monthly reviews. Examples of our areas of focus in the future cycles are the traceability for user testing, defect management, operational effectiveness of Cloud Platform services and controls and ways of working with third parties.

### 2.B Approach is reasonable to achieve scope.

Our assessment of the meetings with the assurance providers, found that for the eight completed reviews, the nature and extent of the procedures performed were appropriate to achieve the expectations and objectives of the review.

The assurance providers performed interviews with key relevant stakeholders to gain an understanding of the CHESS Replacement Project and relevant risks, inspected artefacts and observed CHESS Replacement Project meetings to perform their review and conclude on the results of their review.

### 2.C Capacity and capability of team match scope and approach.

Our workshops with the primary assurance providers and internal and external assurance providers, as well as the inspection of the assurance

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review team lead and members, found that for the eight completed reviews, the capacity and capability of the assurance provider that performed the individual assurance review were commensurate with the requirements of the individual review performed.

The assurance providers had deployed resources with the necessary skills and expertise to perform the assurance reviews.

#### 2.D Deliverables and level of detail are clearly defined.

We have assessed the and found that for the eight completed reviews, the deliverables were clearly documented.

The provided sufficient and appropriate level of details to allow us to understand the scope of the reviews, approach and procedures performed, findings and recommendations, conclusions reached and the supporting evidence assessed.

# 2.E Appropriateness and relevance of findings and recommendations in relation to the procedures executed and the risks intended to be covered

Our assessment of the found that findings and recommendations identified by the assurance reviews were relevant to the risks intended to be covered by the assurance review and procedures performed.

At the time of this report,

- Four reviews raised findings and recommendations.
- Two findings for two reviews (Light Health Check (Sentiment Survey) and the Industry Consultation Process Review) have been closed.
- No findings were raised for three reviews (ASX Delivery Assurance Inflight Review, ASX Test policy and standards assessment for Release 1 Stage 1 Review and Release 1 ASX Industry Test Approach and Planning Review).

Refer to Section 3.1 for the governance processes around management actions and closure of findings.

We will continue to assess the completed assurance reviews in accordance with the criteria set above in our next six-monthly reports.

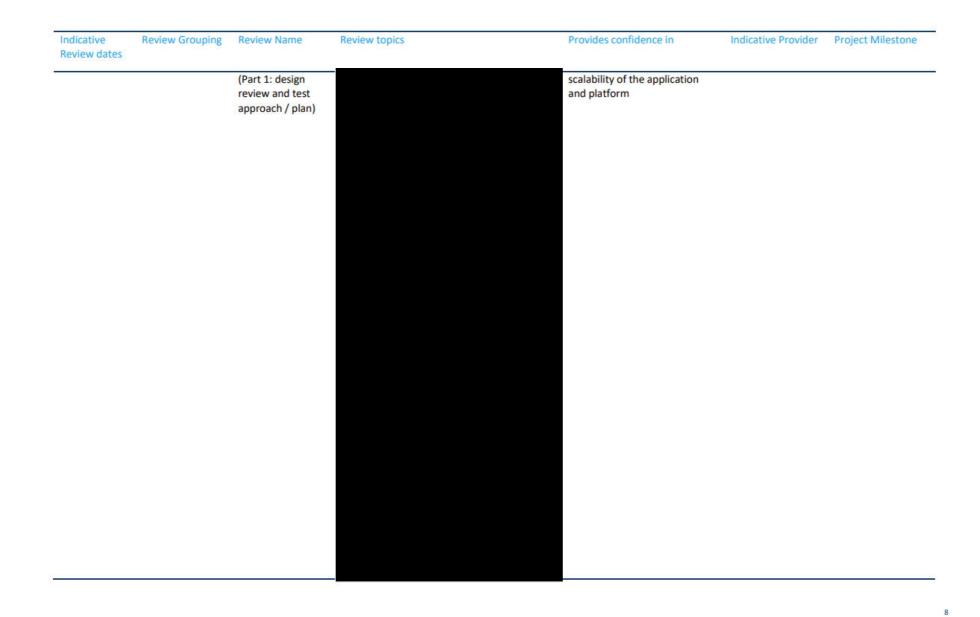

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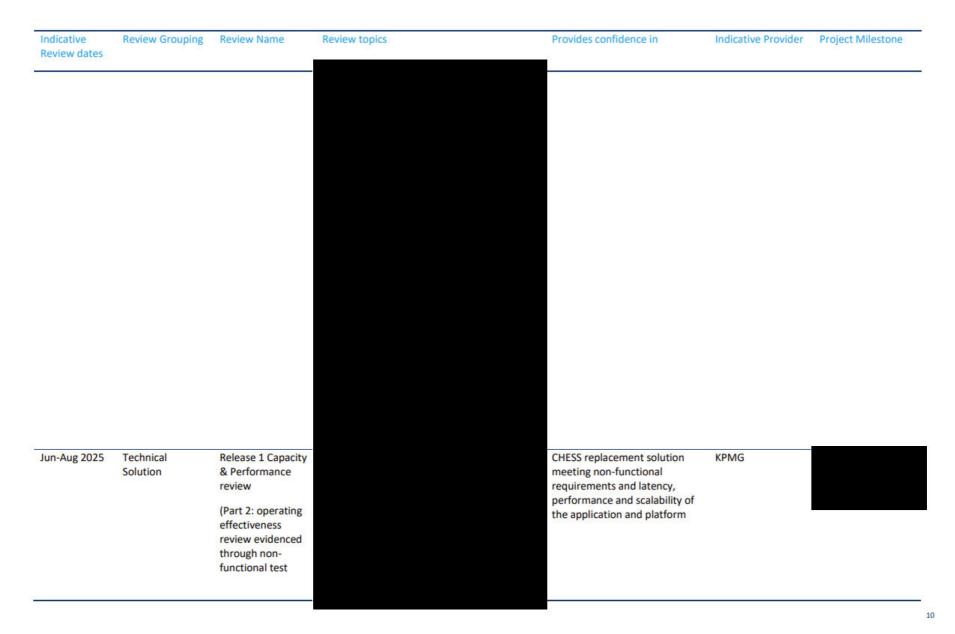
