It is proposed that the TELYS3 will be quoted on the ASX. The waiver also applies with respect of Holding Adjustments for Seven' with respect to the proposed ("Off-Market Buy-Back") scheduled to occur on 24 June 2005. Basis For Decision	Underlying Policy ASTC's concern is in relation to Holdings the subject of a Broker's lien or other security interest. Ordinarily, waivers of ASTC Settlement Rule 5.14.1 would only be considered where there is a monetary limit to the size of the holding, which may be affected by the facility, and that limit is acceptable to ASTC. Present Application The disparity between the handling of bonus issues as required by ASX and NYSE inadvertently opens an opportunity investors who are not entitled to receive the bonus issue to inappropriately gain access to the entitlement. By permitting Constellation to effectively freeze any conversions during the relevant period, this inadvertent opportunity is prevented, with no real disadvantage to any investors who are legitimately entitled to the bonus issue.

By permitting Constellation to effectively freeze any conversions during the relevant period, this inadvertent opportunity is prevented, with no real disadvantage to any investors who are legitimately entitled to the bonus issue.
